

Want to be an LLYC Practitioner?

LAITY LODGE YOUTH CAMP PRACTITIONER

- An MD or APRN usually covers one week of camp, Sunday to Saturday or Saturday to Saturday providing clinic oversight and on-site availability for camper and staff concerns which require practitioner evaluation for LLYC camps.
- RNs and healthcare assistants (at each camp) manage the day-to-day healthcare (med administration, first aid, basic illness treatment) by following our established care protocols.
- The practitioner attends breakfast and supper at Echo Valley and lunch at Singing Hills. During or after meals the nurses inform you if there are patients that need to be seen post meals. Average weekly consults are 11.
- The practitioner is on call 24/7 for emergencies that may arise (stitches, medical issues, accidents, etc.) and is responsible to direct the healthcare staff to provide care and/or transfer.
- The camp is located one hour from the nearest hospital and a minimum of 30-minute response time for EMS. Therefore, it is recommended that the practitioner have emergency, pediatric, or family practice experience. Air evacuation sites located throughout the canyon for emergent situations.
- The remainder of the time, the practitioner and their family are free to enjoy all the camp amenities (hiking, kayaking, swimming, fishing, high ropes, etc). We just ask that you always keep the radio on you (or ask the lifeguard to listen for you). You and your family have private accommodations with a kitchen, bedrooms, and Wi-Fi. All your meals are provided. You are welcome to participate in as many or as few camp activities as you desire.
- This is a volunteer position, but medical liability insurance is provided. Additionally, if you work a full week, you are eligible for one free LLYC camp session for your child or a designated recipient.
